


School of Tourism


Finish with a UQ degree: your choice

After two years of study at Blue Mountains Hotel School (BMHS) or Australian International Hotel School (AlHS), you may decide to study towards a **Bachelor of International Hotel & Tourism Management** at The University of Queensland.
