General English Program

CRICOS Code 035490K

The General English Program focuses on a combination of structured core lessons and a skills development program. The core lessons are centered on a communicative approach, which is used to best integrate critical aspects of listening, speaking, reading, writing and grammar skills. This unique approach better prepares students to use English in real life practical situations as well as develop cross-cultural communication skills.

Course Aim: This program is designed for people who are

learning English for general, practical or cultural

purposes.

Assessment: Students take part in formal weekly assessments

to evaluate their progress and identify areas that

require more attention.

Length of Course: 4 to 52 weeks

Entry Requirements: No formal entry requirements

The AICL General English Program has 6 different levels on offer.

Students learn to analyse systems of language and are encouraged to express various opinions and recognise the degrees and fine lines expressed through language.

Students learn many abstract concepts and structures, which help them express "grey area" concepts.

Students are exposed to new angles on familiar areas and are encouraged to explore their own experience and make contrasts with their own and other cultures.

Students who have already gained basic English skills and need practice to gain fluency.

Students learn to understand and speak English to handle a variety of everyday situations and topics.

Students learn basic English language forms and their uses.









English for Academic Purposes

CRICOS Code 047949C

The English for Academic Purposes Program prepares students for the culture and style of learning in Australian universities. Students are guided through the processes involved in university research, essay and report writing, tutorials and presentations.

The program focuses on one theme each fortnight to develop the critical thinking, academic reading, writing, study, presentation and listening skills necessary for success in tertiary study at both undergraduate and post-graduate levels.

Course Aim: This program will give students the English

communication skills necessary to carry out higher education at an Australian University.

Assessment: Students are assessed continuously during the

course through assignments, including a biography, study plan, descriptions, essay plans, essays, oral presentation and research

report.

Length of Course: EAP 1: 10 weeks / EAP 2: 10 weeks

EAP 1 & 2: 20 weeks

Pre-EAP: up to 10 weeks (Optional)

Entry Requirements: EAP 1: IELTS 5.0 / EAP 2: IELTS 5.5

Pre-EAP: IELTS 4.5

Students below this level will be placed in the General English Program until they reach

the appropriate level required.

English for Academic Purposes

Students learn to handle complex English language structures in a variety of academic circumstances. These are then applied to advanced research strategies, genre essay writing, presentation skills, etc that will enable postgraduate students to deal with the demands of postgraduate studies.

Students learn to handle English language structures in a variety of academic circumstances. These are then applied to research strategies, foundations of essay writing, presentation skills, etc that will enable postgraduate students to deal with the demands of undergraduate studies.

Students learn basic academic skills in English in preparation to enter the English for Academic Purposes program.



IELTS Preparation Program

CRICOS Code 036908C

The IELTS Preparation Program addresses the four modules of reading, listening, speaking and writing. The study elements include IELTS exam strategies, academic skills, cultural awareness development, developing research and presentation skills, and weekly student-teacher interviews. Course delivery aims to balance these study elements to better prepare students to meet university entry requirements as well as cope with the challenges of further studies.

Course Aim: The IELTS Preparation Program will give students

the skills needed to successfully sit for the IELTS exam. An individual's exam results will depend on the length and intensity of their study program taking into account their level of English skill

upon commencement of the course.

Assessment: Students engage in a range of assessments

including IELTS tests, research project presentation,

and essay writing.

Length of Course: 12 to 40 weeks

Entry Requirements: IELTS 5.0 or equivalent

Students below this level will be placed in the General English Program until they reach the

appropriate level required.

IELTS Preparation Program

Students are exposed to complex applications of the IELTS test and apply these to academic analysis and research strategies that lead to English language proficiency at postgraduate studies level.

Students are exposed to applications of the IELTS test and apply these to academic analysis and research strategies that lead to English language proficiency at undergraduate studies level.

Students make the transition from standard English language acquisition to an introduction to the academic language demands of the IELTS test.



Hairdressing Salon Management

The Diploma of Hairdressing Salon Management is a sequentially-delivered program by the Australian Institute of Commerce and Language (AICL) and TAFE NSW-Sydney Institute. The course consists of Certificate III in Hairdressing is delivered at TAFE Gymea campus for 52 weeks followed by the Diploma of Hairdressing Salon Management is delivered at AICL for a further 52 weeks.

Hairdressing legislation around licensing requires people to be over 21 years of age to work as a paid hairdresser. People under 21 working in a salon can only be employed as a salon assistant or indentured apprentice (locals only).






Hospitality Management

The Advanced Diploma of Hospitality Management is a sequentially delivered program offered by the Australian Institute of Commerce and Language (AICL) and TAFE NSW - Sydney Institute. The course consists of Certificate in Hospitality (Commercial Cookery) delivered at TAFE NSW-SI for 52 weeks, followed by the certificate IV in Hospitality (Commercial Cookery) and the Advanced Diploma of Hospitality Management delivered at AICL for a further 58 weeks.

Graduates are awarded with a qualification under the Australian Qualification Framework (AQF).





Certificate III in Hospitality (Commercial Cookery) (AQF3)

The TAFE delivered Certificate III in Hospitality (Commercial Cookery) is for students who wish to develop the skills, knowledge and work related values required to work in commercial, industrial or retail catering industries, patisseries, commercial kitchens and restaurants.

Students will participate in the development of commercial cookery skills and knowledge which will include health and hygiene practices in the kitchen, food storage and safety, planning and controlling for menu based catering and buffets.

This course provides strategies to develop these skills in a variety of kitchen operations, as the competency standards are common to many areas of the hospitality industry.

opportunities such as a chef/cook in a commercial, industrial or retail catering industry
