## Excellency,

Please find attached, the provisional list of speakers for the general debate of the seventy-ninth session of the General Assembly which is expected to take place from 24 to 28 and 30 September 2024.

In line with the annex to resolution 51/241, the list of speakers is customarily prepared based on expressions of preference, adjusted for protocol and takes existing traditions into account in order to best accommodate the needs of Member States.

This year, we received requests for a speaking slot on the first day of the general debate from 134 Member States, represented by 87 Heads of State, 2 Vice Presidents, 1 Crown Prince, 28 Heads of Government, 3 Deputy Prime Ministers and 13 Ministers. Therefore, the principle of "first-come, first-served" in terms of time of inscription was taken into account.

As mentioned in note verbale DGACM/OUSG/GD79 dated 13 May 2024, if, after the issuance of the provisional list of speakers the level of representation of a Member State changes, the replacement speaker will be accommodated as the final speaker in their category. Similarly, if the speaker is upgraded to a higher level, the replacement speaker will be last in their category. This provision is necessary to accommodate all Heads of State or Heads of Government equitably.

Also, in accordance with established practice, delegations are allocated only one slot during the general debate, irrespective of the level of the speaker. Delegations represented at the same level may exchange their slots with each other if both inform the focal point for the list of speakers (Mr. Carlos Galindo) in writing at galindo@un.org, with a copy to gaspeakerslist@un.org. Exchanges will not be considered to have been completed until all the delegations concerned have provided their written confirmation to the focal point. Completed exchanges are considered binding unless all the delegations concerned agree to void them.

All Permanent Representatives and Permanent Observers of the Holy See and the State of Palestine and the Head of Delegation of the European Union to the United Nations New York Based on experience, we expect changes in the level of representation, and therefore hope to be able to accommodate more requests in the revised provisional list of speakers, which would be distributed before the general debate begins.

In accordance with existing practice at the general debate, a voluntary 15-minute time limit should be observed, and the list of speakers has been prepared based on a 15-minute statement by each delegation. In order to assist the speakers with the timely delivery of their statements, a light mechanism will be installed at the rostrum. You may wish to inform your capital of this procedure.
