

Biblical Responsibility for Financial Management (AI)

The Bible frames financial responsibility as a matter of **stewardship**—viewing money not as personal property, but as a resource entrusted by God to be managed with wisdom, honesty, and generosity.

Key scriptures on financial responsibility cover several core principles:

- **Save for the future:** *“The wise man saves for the future, but the foolish man spends whatever he gets.”* (Proverbs 21:20). Building a financial safety cushion and avoiding impulse spending are consistently praised.
- **Work with integrity:** *“Dishonest money dwindles away, but whoever gathers money little by little makes it grow.”* (Proverbs 13:11). Steady, honest work is the biblical foundation for building wealth, rather than get-rich-quick schemes.
- **Provide for your household:** *“Anyone who does not provide for their relatives, and especially for their own household, has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever.”* (1 Timothy 5:8). Taking care of your family’s physical and financial needs is a fundamental responsibility.
- **Generosity:** *“Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.”* (2 Corinthians 9:7).
