This document summarizes a clinical perspective provided by Josfat Ambuka, a senior registered clinical officer, regarding the medically unprecedented recovery of Moses Kimani from advanced HIV/AIDS. The testimony contrasts standard medical protocols for HIV management with the total clinical disappearance of the virus in Kimani’s body following a religious event in 2010.

Clinical Context and the Medical Reality of HIV

Josfat Ambuka, a senior clinical officer with over eight years of experience in both pediatric and adult HIV management, emphasizes that under standard medical science, HIV is considered an incurable, lifelong condition. Once a patient tests positive, they are expected to remain positive and require strict adherence to Antiretroviral Therapy (ART) for the rest of their lives. Medical facilities utilize Comprehensive Care Clinics (CCC) to monitor these patients, often issuing cards that explicitly state in both English and Kiswahili that the medication must be taken "forever" (*milele*). The clinical goal of ART is viral suppression; however, any cessation of medication typically results in a rapid "rebound," where the virus multiplies unimpeded, potentially reaching 12 billion copies per day.

The Case of Moses Kimani: Diagnosis and Symptoms

At the time of his diagnosis in 2010, Moses Kimani (then 42 years old) presented with features of advanced HIV disease. His clinical state was critical, characterized by "extreme wasting," with his weight dropping to only 40.5 kilograms. He suffered from severe opportunistic infections and chronic diarrhea, which was so persistent he reportedly had to remain near a restroom at all times. His medical records were formally documented under Outpatient Number 52968 and CCC Number 2397/10. Despite the severity of his condition, which would typically lead to treatment failure or the need for "salvage regimens" (third-line therapy) if medication was missed, Kimani's symptoms reportedly vanished instantly following a decree of healing.

Medical Verification and Long-term Observation

What the medical community finds "shocking" is the longevity and stability of Kimani's current state. Fifteen years after stopping all antiretroviral medication, Kimani remains HIV negative and in excellent health. This is clinically significant because medical history shows that when patients stop ART, they usually return to clinics on wheelchairs with advanced disease and multi-drug resistance. Kimani's recovery was further verified through a DNA PCR test conducted at Walter Reed (via a blood sample collected at PGH), which confirmed his negative status. The medic concludes that such a total removal of the virus from the blood system is not possible through any known medical therapy and represents a massive intervention.

Conclusion

From a medical perspective, the total absence of viral resurgence after a decade and a half without medication is categorized as a miracle, as it defies the known biological behavior of the HIV virus and the limitations of current antiretroviral therapy.
