1. 대화를 듣고, 두 사람이 주문할 책걸상을 고르시오.

W: Look at this catalog. They have a large selection of desks and chairs.

M: Great. We need to buy some desks and chairs for our clubroom.

W: What do you think about this chair attached to the desk? It's practical.

M: Well, I think it's too heavy to move around. We need desks and chairs that are not attached.

W: What about this rectangular desk?

M: It looks too plain.

W: Then, how about these triangular desks? I think they are good for group activities when assembled.

M: Okay, let's buy them. Now, we have to decide on the chair.

W: How about this chair with armrests?

M: Well, it looks comfortable but I don't think armrests are necessary.

W: You're right. It might be more expensive, too. Let's order the chair without armrests.
