Dear Mr. Dae Suk CHOI,

I am writing in reply to your letter concerning your question about crossing Lithuanian border.

A **valid travel document** (passport or personal identification card) has to be presented by FOREIGN NATIONALS **travelling without visa** while crossing border.

Medical insurance is not required at the border.

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To avoid an insured event, e.g. illness or other need for medical aid, aliens who arrive in the Republic of Lithuania should be covered by health insurance contracts (policies). In this case, when I enter your country,

does a travel medical insurance have to be presented at border crossing points of your country?

Or is a valid passport enough to be presented?
