





During World War II, the U.S. Marines had a difficult problem. They had to find a way to keep their communication secrets. Japan kept breaking the U.S. codes. They knew their enemy's plan, so they had time to prepare.

The Americans became desperate as the Japanese broke code after code. Then Philip Johnson went to the Marines. He had an idea. Johnson had grown up on a Navajo reservation.
