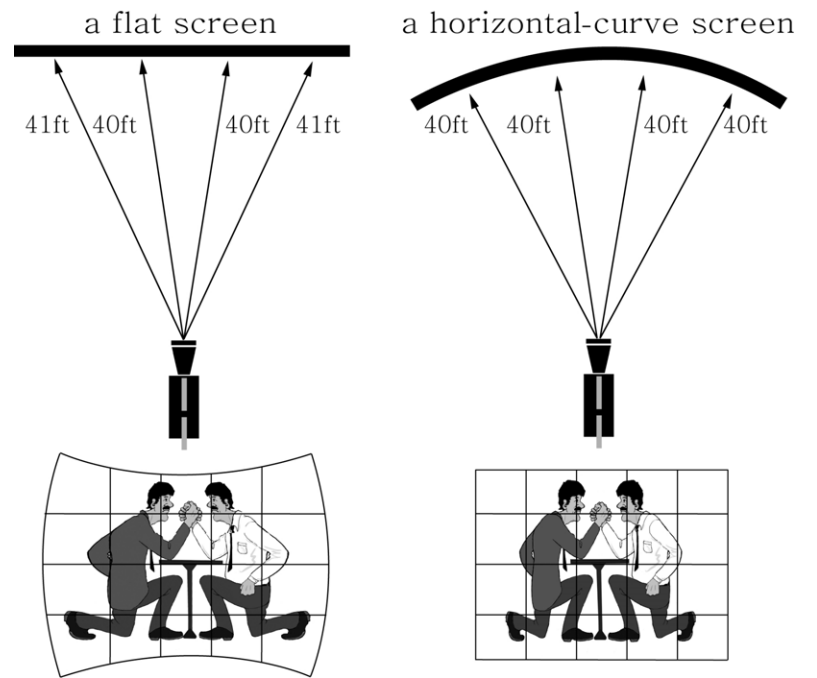

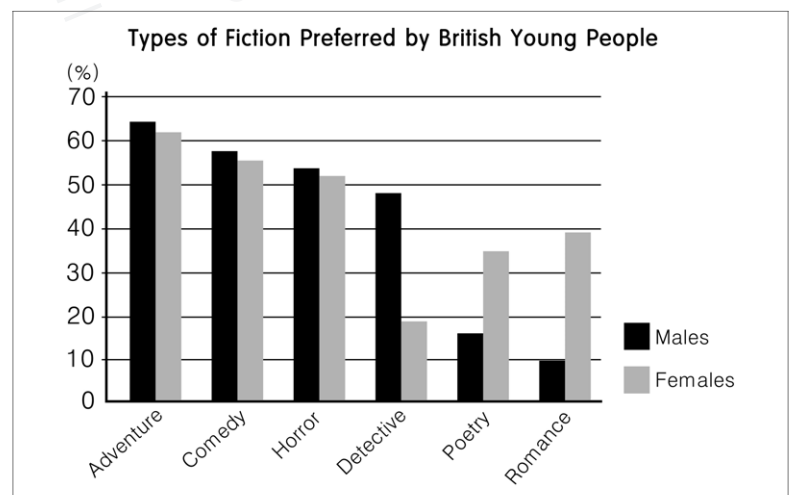

[Person A] Motor vehicle fatality rates for elderly drivers are rising, and older drivers are in more deadly accidents per mile driven than any other age group — except for teenage males.
