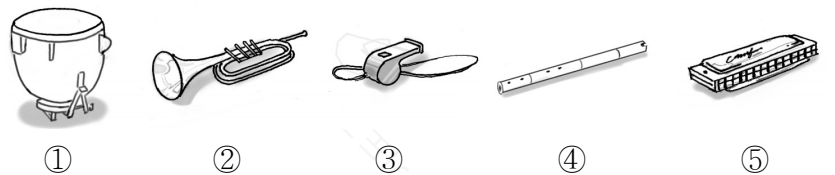

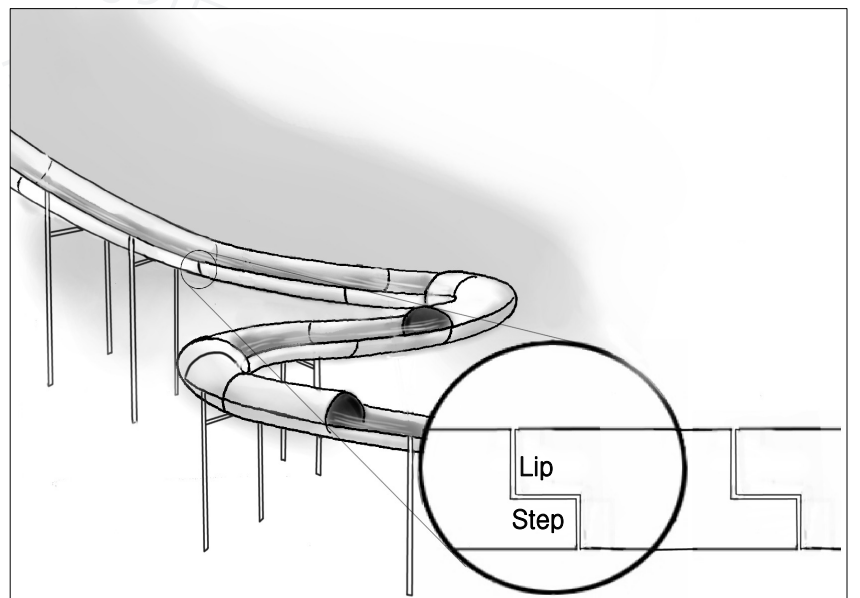

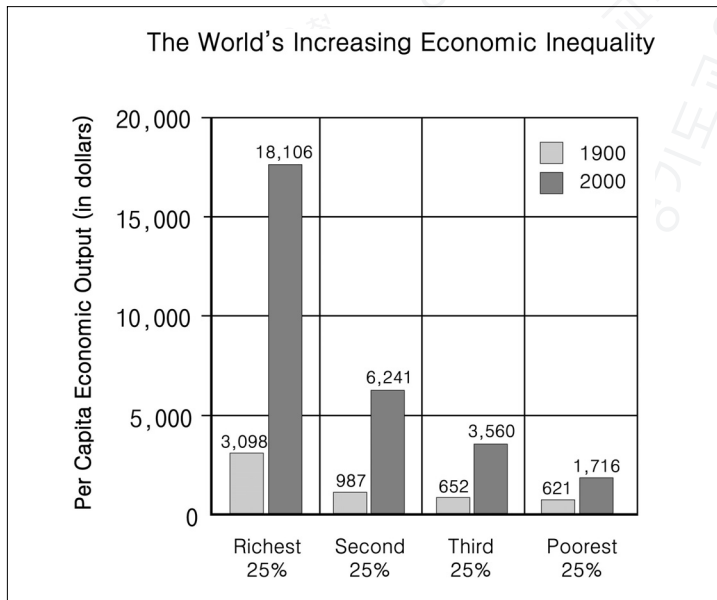

Certainly assaulting a flight attendant is unacceptable behavior, but the airlines must admit that they are responsible for creating such an atmosphere of anger and mistrust among their customers.

More people are flying than ever before and the airlines are doing the best they can to keep up with the increased demand for service. Passengers bear responsibility for their actions.
