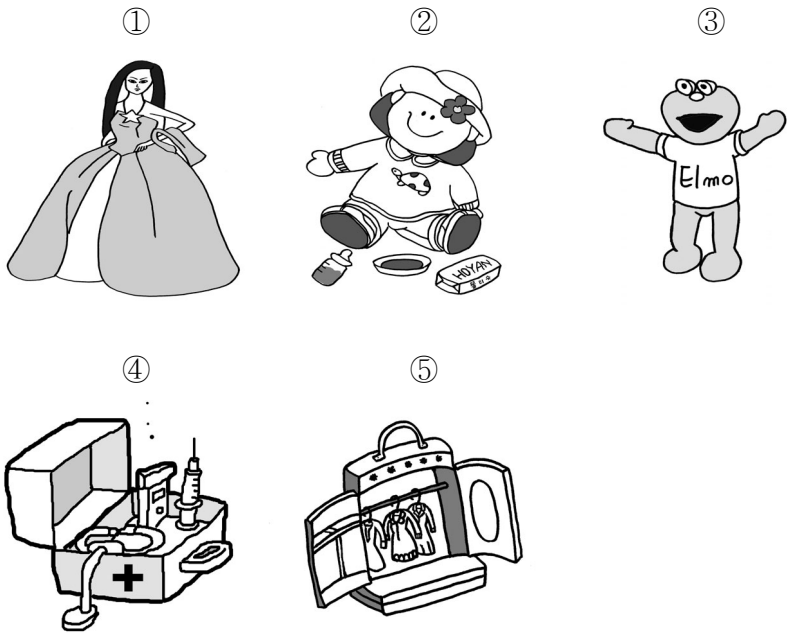

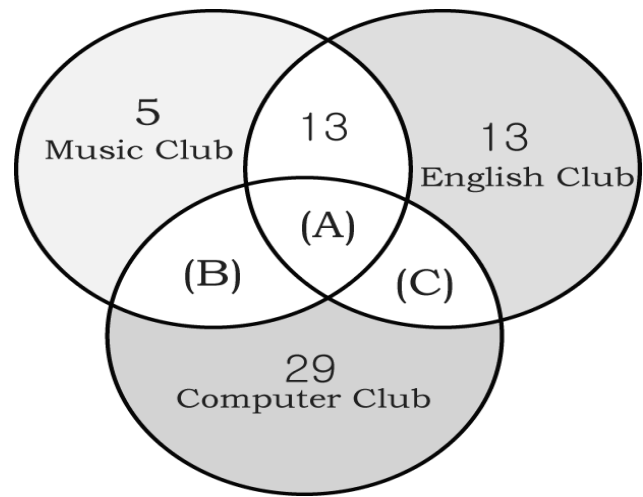

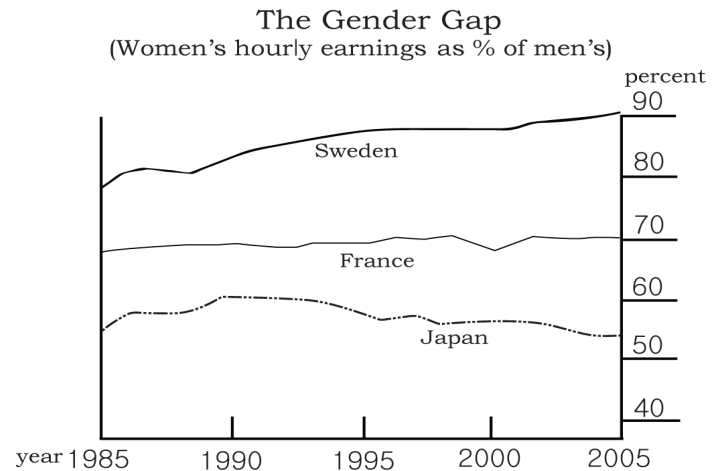

It's easy to trust people who have already proved themselves. It's much tougher to believe in people before they have proved themselves. But that is the key to motivating people to reach their potential. You have to believe in them first, before they become successful, and sometimes before you can persuade them to believe in themselves. Some people in your life eagerly want to believe in themselves but have little hope. As you interact with them, remember this famous statement: “There are no hopeless situations; there are only men and women who have grown hopeless about them.” Every person has seeds of greatness within and when you believe in people, you water the seeds and give them the chance to grow.
