

Person B 'Beggar' in itself is a negative word. It is not properly applied to many unfortunate people in our society. They find themselves homeless or penniless because of unemployment or a miserable family background. These people should not be treated as social failures. They simply need our help. It is all too easy to end up as a beggar on the streets with no family or community support in our increasingly selfish society. Individually and as a society, we have a duty to help them through individual giving on the streets as well as through charities and through government action.
